

**NOTICE OF SECOND SUBSTANTIAL AMENDMENT
TO THE 2019 ACTION PLAN DUE TO CARES ACT FUNDING**

This Notice is being posted to provide the public with an update on the City of South Bend's use of Emergency Solutions Grant – Coronavirus Response (ESG-CV) funds. The allocations of funds can be seen on the chart included on the next page of this notice.

The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) has notified local jurisdictions of supplemental allocations of Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) funds as authorized by the Coronavirus, Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act, Public Law 116-136. The additional funding is provided by HUD to prevent, prepare for, and respond to the Coronavirus pandemic in local communities.

Use of the City of South Bend's additional allocation of Emergency Solutions Grant – Coronavirus Response (ESG-CV2) funds under the CARES Act will be included in a Substantial Amendment to the St. Joseph County Housing Consortium's 2019 Action Plan and may be viewed at the City of South Bend's website at www.southbendin.gov on the Department of Community Investment – Neighborhood Development page.
