Sewer/Water Reconnect

A new Sewer Lateral Reimbursement Program will offer a reimbursement up to \$20,000 for qualified costs of connecting the sewer lateral to new low-and moderate-income homes. This funding may be used to cover the cost of the entire sewer lateral from the main line to the residential structure. Qualifying costs for reimbursement include labor, materials, traffic control, and restoration of pavement, curbs and sidewalks related to the sewer lateral work. Subject to the respective approvals by the Common Council and Board of Public Works, both the revised System Development Charges and the Sewer Lateral Reimbursement Program will be active by mid-July.

LOW INCOME HOME ENERGY ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (LIHEAP)

Are you struggling to pay your energy or water bill?

You may be qualified to receive federal funding to help pay some of your bills this winter. The Low-Income Household Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) is a federally funded program to help Indiana residents pay their utility bills and prevent utility shut offs.

Neighborhood Traffic Calming Meetings

The City of South Bend Public Works Department is holding three public meetings to present and gather feedback on its comprehensive Neighborhood Traffic Calming Plan. The Plan proposes traffic calming measures on 40-plus neighborhood streets across the city where residents have frequently reported speeding by vehicles.

Public meetings will begin on Thursday, February 16. Each meeting will cover the same content and begin with a brief presentation at 5:30 pm followed by an open house where residents can provide feedback to City staff. Residents are invited to attend any of the meetings listed below:

Climate Action Ambassador Program

The Office of Sustainability is recruiting 15 local leaders to serve as Climate Action Ambassadors for the City of South Bend.

Climate Action Ambassadors will facilitate conversations with the community to help prepare for climate change and contribute to the next update of South Bend's Climate Action Plan. Ambassadors will receive a \$250 stipend for their time and participation in the program, which, in addition to leading a Climate Action Survey Session, will require attending:

- 1. An introductory Zoom call
- 2. A two-hour environmental justice training
- 3. One debrief session with other Climate Action Ambassadors.
