

LaSalle Park Neighborhood Priorities Workshops

We are working on creating a draft plan and will update participants on the next steps in the process.

Linden Avenue Streetscape Improvements

As part of its implementation of the Kennedy Park Neighborhood Plan, the City of South Bend is making streetscape improvements to Linden Avenue in coordination with the Martin Luther King, Jr., Dream Center project. The project aims to encourage commercial and residential investment, promote safety and calm traffic.

Starting Monday, March 18, Linden Avenue from Birdsell to College streets will be closed as construction begins on the Linden Avenue Streetscape Project. The three intersections in this three-block stretch will also be closed. Work includes:

- Raised intersections with pedestrian safety bumpouts on Linden Avenue at College and Birdsell streets
- Raised pedestrian crossing on Linden Avenue west of Wilber Street
- Replacement of curb and sidewalks

- New water main, storm and sanitary sewers, street trees, decorative lighting, pavement and landscaping.
- The detour route will be Studebaker and Brookfield streets via Orange Street. Construction is expected to be completed by mid-June, weather permitting.

Notre Dame Avenue - South Bend Avenue - Hill Street Streetscape Improvements

As part of its implementation of the Northeast Neighborhood Plan, the City of South Bend will be making streetscape improvements to Notre Dame Avenue, South Bend Avenue, and Hill Street to encourage investment, promote safety, calm traffic, and expand the active transportation network. A high-quality pedestrian/bicyclist route will be created between downtown South Bend and the University of Notre Dame.

Downtown South Bend Plan Survey



The City, along with community and business partners, announced its commitment to create a formal Downtown Plan, which will set a vision for the future of our downtown and outline concrete steps to get there.

The Downtown South Bend 2045 Plan is a community-led planning process to shape the future of downtown. This survey has 20 questions, followed by an opportunity to provide written comments about topics not addressed in the survey. All survey responses are anonymous and will directly inform the next steps in creating the Downtown South Bend 2045 Plan. This survey may take 5-10 minutes to complete and will be available to the public until Monday, May 20, 2024 at 5 pm. Please contact planning@southbendin.gov with any questions or concerns.

Public Safety

The South Bend Police Department has offered to send an officer to neighborhood association meetings (or attend virtually), per request. You can now also join the Sync South Bend Camera Registry Program.

By registering the cameras at your home or business, you are helping South Bend Police officers and detectives quickly determine where cameras are located and who they need to contact to access them. This information will help expedite investigations and will eliminate the need for an officer or detective to physically visit your home or business to review relevant footage – all clips can be shared and submitted via a secure link.

Weather Amnesty



WEATHER AMNESTY IS ALMOST HERE!!!

Here's what you need to know:

- Amnesty starts on November 1st, 2023 no matter the temperature. If it goes below 32° before then, Center for the Homeless might decide to open up early.
 - CFH serves 50 men, 16 women, and 2 families (female headed households). You will need ID – they can't take anyone with sex offense or arson charges.
- Amnesty ends on April 30th 2024. Again, if temps drop below 32° after then, CFH might stay open later.
- Amnesty starts at 8pm, and ends at 8am. Please show up on time. If you aren't in line on time, we can't promise you a spot.
- No drugs, paraphernalia, alcohol, or weapons can come in with you, and <u>staff</u>
 reserves the right to search you and your stuff. Safety is our first priority. You could be
 barred for the rest of the season if you try to sneak anything in.
- You are expected to follow the all basic rules and respect the staff of the place you
 are staying. You could be barred from that place if you aren't able to do so.
- We may ask for some information about you, even if we are full. This is because we
 need to know how many people we are turning away each night, and your name will help
 us figure out if we are all turning away the same person, or if multiple people were turned
 away. We need this number to prove we need more shelter options in the community.
 Thanks for your cooperation.

Please take care of yourselves, and please think about coming inside and staying in one of our long term programs.

High Skill Immigration Fund

Gaps in high-skilled talent have become challenges for the growth of businesses in the South Bend region.

To fill critical gaps in high-demand jobs locally and to boost the regional economy. The City of South Bend has announced a new program: The High Skill Immigration Fund to attract and retain high skilled talent in the South Bend region and To educate and build capacity of local businesses to enable international talent sourcing

Sewer/Water Reconnect

A new Sewer Lateral Reimbursement Program will offer a reimbursement up to \$20,000 for qualified costs of connecting the sewer lateral to new low-and moderate-income homes. This funding may be used to cover the cost of the entire sewer lateral from the main line to the residential structure. Qualifying costs for reimbursement include labor, materials, traffic control, and restoration of pavement, curbs and sidewalks related to the sewer lateral work. Subject to the respective approvals by the Common Council and Board of Public Works, both the revised System Development Charges and the Sewer Lateral Reimbursement Program will be active by mid-July.

South Bend Vacant Building Credit Enhancement Fund

The Vacant Building Enhancement Fund is a focused revolving loan fund that offers additional financing tools in the rehabilitation of vacant or partially vacant commercial buildings.

The City seeks to support the redevelopment of vacant and underutilized commercial structures throughout South Bend by providing targeted loans to promote commercial real estate projects.

Through the program, loans of up to \$500,000 can be extended for qualified redevelopments.



Community Canopy Tree Program

Help beautify your neighborhood with this free program from SBVPA. South Bend is excited to make it easier on individuals to give back to the environment and create a healthier city. The program only allows trees to be planted on city public right-of-way between the curb and sidewalk (tree lawn). The tree may be up to 10 feet from the curb if no sidewalk exists.

Snow Removal

Property owners and residents are urged to do their best to keep their sidewalks near their property shoveled. Owners or occupants of properties must remove snow and ice from the public sidewalk within 24 hours after the end of any accumulation of snow or ice.

While it is still the responsibility of the owner/occupant to remove the snow, any city resident who is unable to shovel snow from public sidewalks is eligible to complete a Snow Removal Disability Exemption and Waiver of Liability form.


