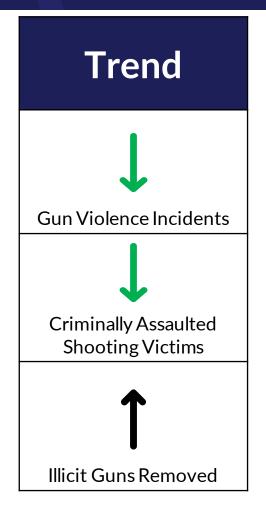

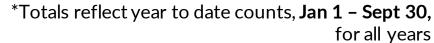


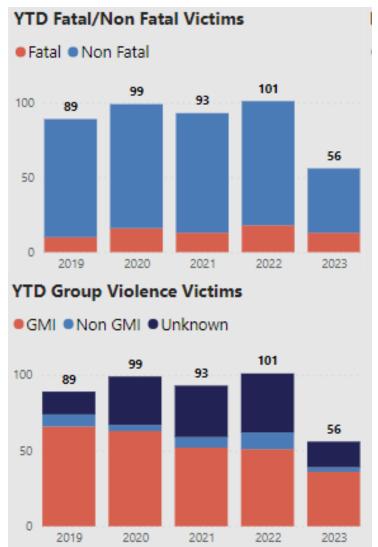
Gun Violence Breakdown

2023 YTD Takeaways:

- 41% decrease in gun violence victims compared to the average at the same time (Jan 1 Sept 30) over the previous 4 years.
- Compared to the same time frame in 2022, there are five fewer fatal victims
 - 2023 YTD: 13 Fatal
 - **2022 YTD:** 18 Fatal
- Majority of shootings involving a victim continue to be Group Member Involved (GMI)
 - 2023 YTD: 64% GMI
 - 2019 2022 average: 61% GMI

- \$62,250 authorized in rewards

• Up to \$1,000 reward for tips leading to an arrest or solving of a felony crime committed with a firearm

Traffic Enforcement

	Q1 2023	Q2 2023	Q3 2023
Traffic Stops*	2,101	2,966	3,943
Daily Average	23.2	32.6	42.8
Percent Change (of daily average)		40.5%	31.3%

^{*}These are traffic violations only

- Enhancing traffic enforcement to address community concerns
- From Q1 to Q3, daily average traffic stops increased by 84.4%
- Staffing increase from end of 2022 to now (231 vs. 244) has allowed for increased enforcement



Mental Health Calls for Service

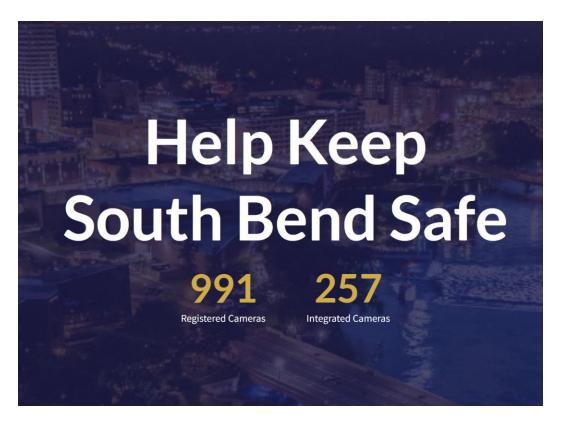

- New metric introduced to the Transparency Hub in 2023
- Tracks the # of mental health related CFS that SBPD is dispatched to
- On the data side, includes calls that are:
 - Initially coded as a mental health related incident type by the dispatcher
 - Or calls marked as "Disposition M"
 - This means an officer responded and found the incident to be mental health related vs. the initial incident type noted by the dispatcher



Sync South Bend Update



Business Security Grant

- Open to South Bend businesses & property managers
- Aims to improve infrastructure & safety of participating businesses and to expand partnerships with SBPD
- Grant amount up to \$5,000 based on security needs
- Eligible expenses include:
 - Cameras, Cloud Storage, Lighting
- Application Deadline this Friday, 10/13/23

What

Technology-based crime reduction strategy to develop possible leads in criminal cases and keep community safe from outside threats.

Who

South Bend Police Department

How

- Utilizes cameras near major thoroughfares to take photos of the backs of vehicles
- 30-day photo retention on cloud server
- Limited users with an administrator for account reviews

Shot Spotter Connect

What

Shot Spotter Connect is a software that provides unbiased, evidence-based direction on where to deploy officers and other department resources and when.

Who

South Bend Police Department

How

- Shot Spotter Connect collects data on case reports, statements, and evidence from the last 24 hours each morning
- Compares to current and past trends from the last three years; prioritizing gun violence
- Monitors officer responsiveness and accountability through GPS
